#### **Lest We Forget**

This year marks the centenary of the commencement of The Great War – what later became known as World War I. The museum in my hometown is putting together information about the local men who made what is known as "the supreme sacrifice". I have been asked by the museum director to write up the story about my grandfather's brother who died of wounds in a military hospital in France in 1918 while his regiment were scaling the walls and liberating the town of Le Chesnoy.

The soldiers' army records are available online and based on these records I have spent many hours researching Uncle Sonny's war history and the circumstances that led to his demise. Until then I had just assumed that he was called up, hopped on a troop ship for England, caught another boat to France, marched

to the front line, jumped into a trench and was shot dead; and then his name got read off the plaque at the War Memorial Hall every Anzac Day. The reality was quite, quite different.

And so it is with that other supreme sacrifice, the one we reflect on particularly as Easter. It can be too easy, because we seem to be so busy, to think about the death of our Lord in a way similar to how I thought of Uncle Sonny's death until I studied the records — rode in to Jerusalem on a donkey, suffered under Pontius Pilate, carried His cross to Golgotha where he was crucified, died and was placed in a tomb. Of course His story doesn't end there, neither did it begin there; and that is why we study the records that we find in the Bible. There is a saying that we don't read the Bible to do God a favour.

May you be particularly blessed this Easter as you read and reflect on what has been described as "The Greatest Story Ever Told".
