GBNZ has partnered with Faith Box to provide company and unit leaders with a fun new way to run devotions. There are 68 engaging and interactive topics covering 8 terms – a whole 2 years' worth! Each session is comprised of a Bible reading, conversation starters, activities, games and crafts

Then we gathered in the hall to hear Judith Martin speak about the GBNZ/IFG Supporters group, and introduce me with stories of her good experiences with Faith Box. We started with Volume 1 Session 1 about Jesus' Amazing Miracles.

Two groups of volunteers came up to act as leaders and 'girls' and they ran the session! We poured hot water on the dinosaur expanding capsules, and asked if that was a 'miracle'. While we read about the true miracle of Jesus feeding the 5,000, the 'girls' fed a breadcrumb to 50 smiley faces! Then it was time for a game! While the leaders tried to capture them in a tea towel, the 'girls' ran to gather 6 paper fish and then arrange them to spell out "With God, all things are possible!"

We had a Q&A session and leaders asked if they could fit the Faith Box session to their time slot, using the parts that suited – YES! It's all new, updated & kept tidy in the Faith Box tin. And don't forget the CD with 3 great songs by Phil Joel (the "Good Morning" one is a great way to call them to devotions, and the "The Old Testament Ice Cream song" and "New Testament" are easy ways to memorise the Books of the Bible.

Finally, a great way to use your Memory Verse dog tag is to have a girl recite it at the beginning of the session and have a bit of a ceremony hanging it around her neck & rewarded her with a treat. At the end of the meeting, return it to the Faith Box for the next girl to earn!
