# The Finance Issue

After catching up with all the i-girlz news last month I am now back to writing to you on a specific monthly topic; this month it is money.

I have had a career in the financial services sector so it has been the norm over the years that whatever committee I went on I seemed to be appointed the treasurer. This suited me – too easy – and meant that I got out of being the secretary as I do not have the gifting to take part in a discussion and record it at the same time – too hard. Up until recently I was on the Finance Team at my church and was often frustrated by the way some of the elders' decisions adversely affected the health of the church's finances. That was until one day our Pastor spoke on how our giving to the church must have no strings attached. He said we just needed to pray that God would use our money for His purposes. After the wee guilt trip, I had the grace to accept this teaching.

And so it must be with our IFG fees – praying that the money will be used wisely to increase Christ's kingdom on earth, especially to girls, and then let it go. Rest assured however that your Ministry Team practice good stewardship, boarding on frugality, and also diligently apply for grants to fund the Ministry. Many funders expect to see some contribution from members (ie national fees).

One funder asks us to use John Wesley's teachings on money on which to base our applications and this is always a thought provoking exercise.

#### So you want to apply for funding to run your i-girlz programme? Here are some things to know to help you with your applications:

iconz4girlz is a programme of The Girls' Brigade New Zealand Incorporated. GBNZ is what is known as an Incorporated Society. (Funders often ask if you are an Incorporated Society.) The number is 221635 and the date of incorporation was 13 March 1953. If you need a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation you may find this on line at www.societies.govt.nz

GBNZ is also a Registered Charity. The registration number is CC26137. Funders like it if you are one of these. If you receive any donations from people (other than funders) you will need to issue a receipt for them to apply for a Tax Credit.

The accounts of some Units will be going through their church's books which will have a GST implication. National Fees to GBNZ are GST zero- rated. (GST Exempt).

Please only apply to local funders in your own region. If you wish to apply to a national funder your application must go through the GBNZ Support Centre. Send it to elizabethd@girlsbrigade.org.nz

You may be donated goods from local companies. Because you operate under a Registered Charity you need to write a thank you letter for the goods.



Your church probably has at least one member with good connections in the world of finance who may agree to act as the financial mentor to your Unit. Have you found that person yet?

# Receiving fees from your girls

Many Units find they get the best response to fee payments through the use of internet banking. This also saves the leaders from having to handle cash and write receipts (except for donations). Record your Unit bank account number on all your notices / newsletters as a reminder.

Church members could be invited to "adopt" a girl and, as well as praying for her, cover the cost of her fees and uniform if her family is not in a position to do so. Or a Home Group may wish to adopt your Unit and pray especially for you at their meetings as well as provide financially support.

GBNZ has a fund called the Aroha Trust which is available to help Units in financial difficulties. This shouldn't happen as your church is responsible for overseeing your finances.
